### **AIDS origin trial delayed, Ashcroft motions to dismiss U.S. Special Virus claims**

SAN DIEGO - Seventy-two hours before human rights activist Boyd E. Graves was scheduled to argue his case demanding review of the U.S. Special Virus Program, the U.S. District Court for Southern Calif. cancelled the initial review hearing originally scheduled for 11 a.m. June 27.

"Chambers are needed for a judicial conference," a spokeswoman for the U.S. Attorney's office said Wednesday morning. "Mr. Graves' hearing has been rescheduled for July third at 11 a.m."

"The Court has known about the conference long before it scheduled the hearing in May," Graves said. "It is uncanny that the court would wait until the twelfth hour to postpone the hearing for six days so as to encompass the fourth of July holiday."

Graves' petition against the United States seeks the full and immediate disclosure of The U.S. Special Virus Program, a federally funded virus development initiative. A 2002 investigation by the U.S. General Accounting Office revealed the formerly secret U.S. Special Virus was once considered a secret 'black budget' program.

"We believe the review of the U.S. Special Virus Program will garner our best opportunity to dismantle yet another government human experimentation program gone awry," Graves said. "We have evidence of man playing god to the detriment of the masses. This year Independence Day is on July 3, 2003 at 11 a.m. in court. There will be no bigger fireworks."

Graves v. The United States Case no. 02 CV 02396 has been rescheduled for July 3, 2003 in courtroom six at 11 a.m. before Clinton-era appointee Judge Jeffrey T. Miller in the U.S. District Court for Southern California.

- WHAT:** Graves v. The United States Case no. 02 CV 02396 has been rescheduled for July 3 in court room six at 11 a.m. before Clinton-era appointee Judge Jeffrey T. Miller in the U.S. District Court for Southern California. Case no. 02 CV 02396 was filed by Boyd E. Graves Dec. 6, 2002 seeking the full and immediate disclosure of a federal program called The U.S. Special Virus Program. In March the court found Graves competent to prosecute the United States in *propria persona* and on May 5, 2003 scheduled trial date to begin June 27, 2003.
- HOW:** On June 24 at 11:56 a.m. the U.S. District Court for Southern Calif. posted an updated docket postponing Graves v. The United States to July 3, 2003. Wednesday the U.S. Attorney's office (Eileen 619-557-5662) said the Chambers needed for judicial conference and hearing was rescheduled for July 3, 2003.
- WHO:** **Boyd E. Graves** is considered the leading investigator of the U.S. Special Virus Program's 1971 Research Logic Flow Chart. Graves' judicial activism has included requests for a formal review of the U.S. Special Virus development program through the United Nations, U.S. Congress, and the U.S. Supreme Court. Graves was born July 10, 1952. Graves is a 1972 United States Naval Academy graduate and served as communications officer aboard the USS Buchanan. Graves received his Juris Doctorate degree from Ohio Northern University in 1992. Graves worked with the disabled population as special counsel for the Americans with Disabilities Act. Graves appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court Case No. 00-9587 seeking review of the U.S. Special Virus program was denied June 4, 2001. In response to a separate lawsuit Graves filed Dec. 6 2002 against the U.S. Sepcial Virus Program, the U.S. District Court for Southern California ruled Graves competent to pursue his petition against the United States *in propria persona*.
- The Honorable Jeffrey T. Miller** was born Jan. 14, 1943 in New York, NY and was nominated by President William J. Clinton on Jan. 7, 1997 to a seat vacated by Gordon Thompson, Jr. Judge Miller was confirmed by the Senate on May 23, 1997 and received commission on May 27, 1997. Miller graduated the University of California in 1964 and earned his Juris Doctorate from University of California, Los Angeles, School of Law in 1967. Judge Miller served as California's Deputy State Attorney General between 1968 and 1987 before service as California Superior Court Judge for San Diego County 1987 to 1997.
